Regulations – See Health Regulations document on fair website. Note those specifically related to Pullorum-Typhoid testing for poultry and Mycoplasma gallisepticum testing for turkeys.

Poultry Rules and Instructions

1. All junior poultry exhibitors must be certified in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) in 2022, and submit their certification number through Fair Entry by May 31 at 4:30 pm to exhibit poultry at the Green County Fair.
2. Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions, in addition to Livestock Auction Rules, if applicable.
3. The Fair Association is not responsible for birds lost, stolen or that die.
4. Each exhibitor allowed 1 entry per lot, a total of not more than 9 lots. (Showmanship does not count toward your Lot total)
5. All cockerels/pullets entered in Class A must have been hatched after the previous year's Green County Fair.
6. It is recommended that exhibitors use some form of identification for birds. Examples include leg band, wing band, etc.
7. Birds must originate from a certified flock or be individually tested, in accordance with WI Department of Ag, Trade and Consumer Protection requirements. Testing must be performed by a certified pullorum tester authorized by DATCP.
8. Each exhibitor **MUST** provide a copy of the Flock Status certificate or Individual Testing paperwork at check-in on Tuesday of the fair. The Fair Office will NOT print or copy this paperwork. Birds without this information will be sent home.
9. All poultry must be checked in between 9:00 a.m. to Noon on Tuesday of the fair, before being put in a pen.
10. Exhibitors must provide a water container that **CANNOT** be tipped over for each of their pens.
11. Exhibitors must be present during all judging.
12. **NEW** this year – All entries in Classes B & C (with the exception of Lot 50 Market Ducks and Lot 51 Turkeys) will be judged in the center of the Stock Pavilion, similar to entries in Class A.
13. Each exhibitor must daily take care of his/her own exhibit(s). This includes morning and evening chores, and throughout the day, as needed. Birds not taken care of daily may be sent home and the member will forfeit the premium money on the exhibit(s) and eligibility to exhibit in this department next year.
14. Sawdust and shavings must remain in place until 6:00pm on Sunday at check-out time. Sawdust and shavings must be discarded in the pit on the other side of the swine barn, NOT in the dumpster.
15. All exhibitors are required to clean their cages prior to leaving the fairgrounds on Sunday evening, or the exhibitor will forfeit the premium money on the exhibits and eligibility to exhibit in this department next year.
16. Vehicles are not allowed to park around the livestock building between 8am and 8pm from Wednesday through Saturday and from 8 am to 6pm on Sunday of the fair. Exhibitors will be able to bring in feed and supplies to the barns between 8pm and 8am only.

Cock: Hatched before the previous year's Green County Fair.

Hen: Hatched before the previous year's Green County Fair.

Variety: The various plumage colors and comb types within a breed

CLASSES B & C – PRODUCTION CLASS

Poultry Rules and Instructions

- A. Roasters (Lot 52), Ducks (Lot 50) & Turkeys (Lot 51) will be weighed upon arrival at check in on Tuesday between 9:00 am-Noon. There will be no repeat weighing or swapping out birds.
- B. A pair of chicken roasters must have a combined weight of no less than 16 lbs. to sell in the auction. A pair of ducks (1 male & 1 female) must have a combined weight of 10 lbs. or more to sell. A pair of turkey hens must have a combined minimum weight of no less than 25 pounds to sell. (See the Meat Animal Auction Rules for complete details.)
- C. Turkeys must be less than 6 months old.
- D. The Chicken roaster pairs (Lot 52) will be divided if more than 16 pairs are entered. Roaster pairs will be grouped into lots according to their weigh-in weight. Lot divisions will be posted prior to 5:00 pm on Wednesday. Top two pairs in each weight division will compete for Pair of Roaster champion and reserve.
