**Grades 5K-2 - Classes A-H**

**Rules and Instructions**

- a) All lots are judged Face-to-Face
- b) Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions.
- c) The Fair Association is not responsible for articles lost/stolen during the fair.
- d) Exhibitors are responsible for securing to the display or exhibit all loose pieces of the entry (i.e. wire, zip ties, string, or glue).
- e) All models should be mounted on a base or platform no larger than 18"x18".
- f) Posters must be no larger than 14"x22" and have a title. Displays must be no larger than 28"x40".
- g) Pictures can be cutouts, drawings, or photos.
- h) Pictures should be glued on to a poster or mat with rubber cement and be labeled.
- i) No real food or live animals are to be exhibited.
- j) Put name, age, club, class, and lot number on the back side of every entry.
- k) Participants receive ribbons **ONLY**. No premiums.
- l) Members can enter up to 4 lots.
- m) Projects will be checked in and judged on Saturday, July 15, 9:00 AM-1:30 PM. Projects are released at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 23.

**CLASS A – ANIMAL SCIENCE**

**Lot**

- 1. Create a critter (i.e. puppet, clay, recycled items)
- 2. A homemade toy or treat for my pet(s)
- 3. Scrapbook or memory book about my pet
- 4. Bird feeder
- 5. Bird house
- 6. Craft that is animal related
- 7. Any other pet/animal exhibit (No Live Animals)

**CLASS B – ARTS & COMMUNICATION**

**Lot**

- 10. Musical instrument made by exhibitor
- 11. Scrapbook of photos done by member (with captions/journaling)
- 12. T-shirt decorated by exhibitor (on hanger)
- 13. Small wood item
- 14. Any craft item
- 15. Item of art from a kit (i.e. paint by number, scratch art, etc.)

**CLASS C – HOME ECONOMICS**

**Lot**

- 20. My Family Tree (poster, scrapbook, etc.)
- 21. Small silk flower arrangement done by exhibitor

45. Exhibit about wildlife in your backyard
46. Exhibit, rock and mineral collection

## **CLASS F – PERSONAL GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT**

### **Lot**

50. Book or scrapbook all about me
51. Poster or Scrapbook of adult community workers with photos, journaling, and/or autographs (minimum of 5, maximum of 10; i.e. sales clerks, banker, post office worker, hospital worker, etc.)
52. Exhibit about something I did for the first time this year (i.e. swim, skateboard, cook, roller skate, drive go-kart, etc.)

54. Any other related exhibit or poster

## Grades 3-4 – Classes J-O

### Exploring Rules and Instructions

#### **BE SURE TO READ**

- a) Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions.
- b) The Fair Association is not responsible for articles lost/stolen during the fair.
- c) Exploring is for members in grades 3 and 4 ONLY.
- d) No more than 4 Lots entered.
- e) No prepared foods or animals are to be exhibited.
- f) Posters must be no larger than 14"x22", and displays must be no larger than 28"x40", unless otherwise stated.
- g) Scrapbooks must have a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 10 pages.
- h) Displays other than posters can include diorama, mobiles, shadow boxes, 3-D models, booklets, etc.
- i) Poems should be 40 lines or less.
- j) Stories, interviews, etc. – 250 words or less.
- k) Exhibitors are PROHIBITED from duplicating exhibits and entering them in this and another department (i.e. entering same photo in Exploring and Photography departments)

## CLASS J – EXPLORING NATURE AND SCIENCE

### **Lot**

1. 6 insects, properly displayed and identified
2. Display of 10 leaves properly mounted and identified
3. Poster (11"x14") of 6 items found on a nature hike, identified
4. "My Going Green" project
5. Make any weather related project
6. Display (no larger than 11"x14") of at least 6 rocks and/or fossils, identified
7. Picture of wildflowers (11"x14" poster)
8. Any display about prehistoric animals and plants
9. Any display about space/astronomy
10. Pictures of clouds (11"x14" poster)
11. "My Square Foot Treasure Hunt". (Exhibit about what you found in a square foot of soil. Describe the site and what "treasures" were found.)
12. Exhibit, rock and mineral collection
13. Exhibit, fossil collection
14. Any other nature or science related project

## CLASS K – EXPLORING BUILDING AND FIXING

### **Lot**

20. Homemade puzzle
21. Small woodworking item (i.e. bird box, sanding block, etc.)
22. Homemade First Aid Kit (no larger than 8"x12")
23. Simple bird feeder made from recycled material
24. Simple electrical/electronic project
25. Simple homemade musical instrument
26. Bird feeder or bird house made from wood
27. Display of tools used in building and fixing
28. Any item from recycled material
29. Homemade catapult
30. Any other building and fixing related project

## **CLASS L – EXPLORING FOODS AND NUTRITION**

### **Lot**

35. Poster showing nutritious snacks
36. Poster of items (pictures or drawings) needed to make my favorite food (indicate the food and label items)
37. Display showing results of taste test you conducted
38. Poster on kitchen safety
39. Dairy promotion poster
40. Promotional poster for any other Wisconsin food product
41. Recipe file with recipes of things made by exhibitor (minimum 5 recipes)
42. My Food Plate Exhibit
43. "Be the Chef!" (Display or exhibit of when you planned a menu and helped prepare the meal).

## **CLASS M – EXPLORING PLANTS AND ANIMALS**

### **Lot**

50. Collection of 15 seeds (flower, fruit, and/ or vegetable), mounted and labeled
51. Plate of 3 vegetables raised by member
52. House plant started as leaf, seed or stem cutting
53. Terrarium or dish garden
54. Poster showing parts of an animal
55. Scrapbook about pet or other animal (include pictures and stories)
56. Chart or display about your study of insects
57. Original story or poem about your favorite plant or animal
58. Poster showing proper pet care
59. Any other plant or animal related exhibit

## **CLASS N – EXPLORING ARTS AND CRAFTS**

### **Lot**

76. Drawing or painting art piece (should be mounted on a firm backing with a secure hanger)
77. Ceramics item (made and painted by member)
78. Simple, easy to make craft item (kits may be used)
79. Craft item (basketry, jewelry, leather, macramé, etc. Kits may be used.)
80. Any arts and crafts related item that doesn't fit into other lot numbers.
