- e) Each exhibit must have a short write-up explaining what is involved in caring for this animal. Exhibit will not be complete without this write up. The entry tag must be attached to the write-up and left on display during the fair.

70. A short story, (1-4 pages in length) – Fact or fiction; Horse related and original work.
71. Poetry – Horse related and original work
72. Scrapbooking – Tells a story, horse related and original work
