CLASS A – VETERINARY SCIENCE

1. Poster of Breeds, characteristics, etc. of an animal species
 2. Poster or display covering pet or livestock housing
 3. Poster or display showing the life cycle of your favorite animal
 4. Poster or display showing the roles of animal body systems
 5. Poster or display comparing pet food ingredients, prices
 6. Poster or display on how to keep indoor pets safe
 7. Poster or display on how to store animal medication
 8. Any other display

- Lot **Grades 6-9**
15. Poster that shows types of animal stresses and how it affects them
 16. Poster or display showing the importance of colostrum in a newborn animal
 17. Poster or display showing a parasite life cycle
 18. Poster showing how to read and use a medication label
 19. Poster identifying specific animal disease (pick animal of choice)
 20. Poster showing the various methods of animal vaccination
 21. Poster that highlights disease prevention practices at home or on the farm
 22. Display of various tools that a veterinarian would use

Rules and Instructions

- a) Cavies, Hamsters, and Pocket Pets will be judged in Exhibition Hall
- b) They will be brought in at the time of showing and taken home immediately afterwards. Exhibitors must be present for judging.
- c) No cages will be provided.
- d) Each exhibitor may show a total of two animals.
- e) Each exhibit must have a short write-up explaining what is involved in caring for this animal. Exhibit will not be complete without this write up. The entry tag must be attached to the write-up and left on display during the fair.

CLASS C – HORSE EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Open to members enrolled in the Horse and Horseless Horse projects.

Entries must be turned in to Department 10 – Animal/Veterinary Science in Exhibition Hall, on Tuesday of the Fair, between Noon-7:00pm. Judging will take place on Thursday at approximately 10:00am.

Posters should be 14"x22" and displays no larger than 28"x40", unless otherwise stated.

Photos cannot be duplicated and entered in BOTH this department and the Photography department.

Lot

1. A short story, (1-4 pages in length) – Fact or fiction; Horse related and original work.
2. Poetry – Horse related and original work
3. Scrapbooking – Tells a story, horse related and original work
4. Educational poster on Horse related topic (i.e. care, training, health, nutrition, breeds, anatomy, safety) 14"x22" (no foam board)
5. Creative design poster on Horse related topic (i.e. collage, advertisement, promotions) 14"x22" (no foam board)
6. Drawing – any media; Horse related and original work; finished matte size – 9"x12" to 18"x24", 3" border.
7. Painting - any media, minimum 9"x12" to maximum 18" x 24" (finished matte size – no glass, 3" border)
8. Any other craft item: leathercraft, puzzle, glass, etc.
9. Action photo – horse in movement
10. Non-action photo – horse without movement
11. Horse related photo – Horse related items (tack, trailer, clothing, statue, etc.) but no live horse
12. Item built from wood – horse related (rocking horse, furniture, etc.)
13. Item made from wood – horse use (saddle rack, tack box, etc.)
14. An exhibit of any other phase of the project
