### Child Development Rules and Instructions

- a) Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions.
- b) Fair Association is not responsible for articles lost/stolen.
- c) All exhibits must be made by exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
- d) All paint on objects must be lead free.
- e) Stuffed toys – can be made from a pattern or be original. Kits or pre-stamped fabric toys will be accepted in designated lots only.
- f) All classes exhibited must be accompanied by a note card including the following information:
  1. **Use of item**
  2. **Age of child using**
  3. **Type of paint, if any**
- g) Definitions: Toy – to play or amuse oneself; Game – has rules – a person wins or has an objective.
- h) Poster size – 14”x22” and display sizes no larger than – 28”x40”, unless otherwise stated
- i) Please note that due to new restrictions, posters and tri-fold displays are not eligible for WI State Fair selection. We encourage youth to consider other creative ways to exhibit what they have learned. Displays other than posters can include diorama, mobiles, shadow boxes, 3-D models, booklets, etc.
