Poultry Rules and Instructions

1. Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions, in addition to Livestock Auction Rules, if applicable.
2. Fair Association is not responsible for birds lost, stolen or that die.
3. Each exhibitor allowed 1 entry per lot, total of not more than 7 lots. (Showmanship does not count toward your Lot total)
4. All cockerels/pullets entered in Class A must have been hatched after January 1st of the exhibit year.
5. It is recommended that exhibitors use some form of identification for birds. Examples include leg band, wing band, etc.
6. Birds must originate from a certified flock or be individually tested, in accordance with WI Department of Ag, Trade and Consumer Protection requirements. Testing must be performed by a certified pullorum tester authorized by DATCP.
7. Each exhibitor **MUST** provide a copy of the Flock Status certificate or Individual Testing paperwork at check-in on Tuesday of the fair. (NEW) The Fair Office will NOT print or copy this paperwork. Birds without this information will be sent home.
8. **All poultry must be checked in between 12:30 to 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday of the fair, before being put in a pen.**

9. Exhibitors must provide a water container that **CANNOT** be tipped over for each of their pens.
10. Exhibitors must be present during all judging.
11. Each exhibitor must daily take care of his/her own exhibit(s). This includes morning and evening chores, and throughout the day, as needed. **Birds not taken care of daily may be sent home and the member will forfeit the premium money on the exhibit(s) and eligibility to exhibit in this department next year.**
12. All exhibitors are required to clean their cages prior to leaving the fairgrounds on Sunday evening, or the exhibitor will forfeit the premium money on the exhibits and eligibility to exhibit in this department next year.
13. **Vehicles are not allowed to park around the dairy and livestock building between 8am and 8pm from Wednesday through Saturday and from 8 am to 6pm on Sunday of the fair. Exhibitors will be able to bring in feed and supplies to the barns between 8pm and 8am only.**

Age Classification

Cock: Hatched before January 1 of the exhibit year

Cockerel: Hatched January 1 or after of exhibit year

Hen: Hatched before January 1 of exhibit year

Pullet: Hatched January 1 or after of exhibit year

Breed: A group of birds of similar shape and size

Variety: The various plumage colors and comb types within a breed

CLASS B – PRODUCTION CLASS

Poultry Rules and Instructions

1. Roasters (Lot 3), Ducks (Lot 1) & Turkeys (Lot 2) will be weighed upon arrival at check in on Tuesday, between 12:30-4:00 p.m. There will be no repeat weighing, or swapping out birds.
2. A pair of chicken roasters must have a combined weight of no less than 16 lbs. to sell in the auction. A pair of ducks (1 male & 1 female) must have a combined weight of 10 lbs. or more to sell. A pair of turkey hens must have a combined minimum weight of no less than 25 pounds to sell. (See the Meat Animal Auction Rules for complete details.)

Lot

1. Best pair of Ducks (one male, one female)
2. Best pair of Turkeys (Hens only)
3. Best pair of Roasters (2 birds, either sex)
4. Any crossbred meat type (red ear lobe single)
5. Any crossbred egg type pullet
6. Any crossbred egg type laying hen
