All participants MUST adhere to all the 4-H Horse and Pony safety rules. Minimum requirements include: Wearing properly fitted ASTM/SEI approved protective headgear, as required for all riders when mounted or driving. Protective and appropriate foot gear with a heel when handling or riding a horse. A saddle (mounted) and bridle (mounted/cart) are required when riding or driving a horse (NO riding a horse bareback).

- All horses in attendance must have an original and copy of their negative EIA test (Coggins) within the previous 12 months. Horses from outside Wisconsin must also have an original and copy of their Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) within the previous 30 days.
- **Grade 6 & Older (minimum age of 12) can Qualify for State Horse Expo competition if the rider earns a Blue ribbon in at least one qualifying class. Paperwork must be completed and returned to the Extension Office by Thursday, July 22, 2021 at 4:30pm.**
- Classes with an asterisk (*) DO NOT qualify for the WI 4-H Horse Expo held in September of 2021.
- Classes with a dollar sign (\$) after them are Danish judged classes and DO qualify Blue ribbon youth to be eligible for State 4-H Horse Expo. Exhibitors will get paid for the first two premium classes for one horse. If they show a second horse, you may receive one additional premium in a separate lot. You may still receive ribbons and trophies.
