



## GREEN COUNTY FAIR ANIMAL NUMBER REPORTING GUIDE

Again this year, all clubs or chapters with animal exhibitors in departments 1-5, 7 & 8 need to report their animal/pen counts directly to the lead superintendents in each species area, so that more accurate information can be gathered. Club organizational leaders or chapter advisors may choose to delegate this responsibility to a lead species contact for their club, to take on the responsibility for gathering this information and contacting the lead superintendent.

The information requested below **MUST** be reported to the lead superintendents by the **DEADLINE of Wednesday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. Do NOT contact the Extension office with this information. When contacting the lead superintendents, *please be sure to include: **Club Name, Exhibitor Name, and Your Phone Number***.

Please note that Lead Superintendents intend to post stalling assignments by Saturday, July 13<sup>th</sup> at Noon. There should be no decorating until after stalling assignments have been posted.

- **Dairy** – Rudy Kaderly - [rjkaderly@gmail.com](mailto:rjkaderly@gmail.com) or 608-312-9139: How many dairy animals being brought broken down by size ie. calf, yearling heifer or cow and how many families in club or organization.
- **Beef** – Todd Forrester – [tnkffc@gmail.com](mailto:tnkffc@gmail.com) or 608-558-2053: Need to know how many head they are bringing and how many families are in the club/chapter.
- **Swine** – Loran Klitzman – [loran.klitzman@plantpioneer.com](mailto:loran.klitzman@plantpioneer.com) or 608-751-9858: How many total pigs will be coming, how many can be penned together –(pigs for siblings will be penned together) and pens can hold up to 3 pigs, total number of pens needed and how many families in club or organization. (Note—This should not be the number of Pigs ID'd, only the number coming to the fair)
- **Sheep** – Kelly Dunphy - 608-290-3133 (call or text): Please provide the group name, names all the exhibitors, the number of sheep actually planning to bring, and the number of pens requesting (not including storage space). Please note, pens can usually hold up to 3-4 sheep.
- **Goat** – Ron Gordee - [knitingnut59@yahoo.com](mailto:knitingnut59@yahoo.com) or 608-293-0580: How many kids, how many dairy animals and how many meat animals they are bringing. Can kids be penned with adults, and can dairy be penned with meat goats? Also need to know what goats are coming from the same farm and can be penned together. Please note that pen space is extremely limited and goats will need to be combined whenever possible.
- **Poultry** – Melissa Flannery - [mjleonard@uwalumni.com](mailto:mjleonard@uwalumni.com) or 608-558-7037: Need to know what is not coming, size of exhibition ducks (not market ducks) and if they have a big boy that needs a big cage that is helpful.
- **Rabbit** – Crystal Beer - [crys9950@gmail.com](mailto:crys9950@gmail.com): It is most helpful to know what is not coming, so we do not label the pens. We are not looking for other information at this time.
