Clothing Construction Rules and Instructions

- a) Exhibitors and their families are responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Fair General Rules & Instructions.
- b) The Fair Association is not responsible for articles lost/stolen during fair.
- c) All entries in Classes A-H must be the result of the labor of the exhibitor in the clothing project since September 1 of last year.
- d) **Most garments made for Clothing Construction (Classes A-D) MAY ALSO be entered in the Style Revue (Classes E-H).**
 - a. **Clothing Construction** is judged based on how well an item is sewn.
 - b. **Style Revue** is judged on how the item fits the individual and construction, but only as it affects the outward appearance.
 - e) Special care will be taken to keep the garments in good condition and to prevent losses, but garments are displayed at owner's risk.
 - f) All garments must be **ON HANGERS!!!**

Clothing Style Revue Rules and Instructions

1. Fair Association is not responsible for articles lost/stolen.
2. No member can enter more than 4 classes.
3. Clothing **MUST** be modeled by the person for whom it was made.
4. **Most garments made for Style Revue (Classes E-H) MAY ALSO be entered in the Clothing Construction (Classes A-D).**
5. **ALL garments must be on hangers.**
6. Purchased outfits have been moved to Classes I-J – Looking Good.
7. Style Revue garments will be judged on the following:
 - I. The Costume and the Member
 - a. Style of costume
 - b. Becoming color
 - c. Appropriateness of fabric
 - d. Selection of undergarments
 - e. Selection of accessories
 - f. Fit
 - II. The Costume Itself
 - a. Appropriateness of trimmings
 - b. Selection and quality of construction method
 - c. Present condition of costume
 - d. Upkeep in relation to costume value
 - III. The Member
 - a. Posture
 - b. Poise
 - c. Grooming
