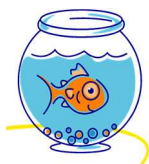

1. Read the **General Fair Rules & Instructions** document!!
2. Read the **Animal Health Rules & Regulations** document!
3. **ALL** projects must be check-in and exhibited on the dates declared above.
4. All exhibitors are encouraged to be present for judging.
5. Posters can be no larger than 14"x22", and displays can be no larger than 28"x40".
6. If graphics/photos/research are not the original work of the exhibitor, the source must be noted on the project. Exhibits that do not cite sources of content that are not exhibitor's original work will be dropped one ribbon placing and not be eligible for awards.

CLASS A – GRADES 3-5

CLASS F – HORSE EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Premiums: \$1.75 \$1.50 \$1.25 \$1.00

Rules & Regulations

- a) Also opened to horse exhibitors.
- b) Entries must be check-in and judged on the date listed in the heading.
- c) Posters should be 14"x22", displays no larger than 28"x40". Unless otherwise stated.
- d) Exhibits must be horse related and original work of the exhibitor

70. A short story, (1-4 pages in length) – Fact or fiction
71. Poetry
72. Scrapbooking
73. Educational poster (i.e. care, training, health, nutrition, breeds, anatomy, safety) 14"x22" (no foam board)
74. Creative design poster (i.e. collage, advertisement, promotions) 14"x22" (no foam board)
75. Drawing – any media; finished matte size – 9"x12" to 18"x24", 3" border.
76. Painting - any media, minimum 9"x12" to maximum 18" x 24" (finished matte size – no glass, 3" border)
77. Any other craft item: leathercraft, puzzle, glass, etc.
78. Action photo – horse in movement – 8"x10" mounted on 11"x14" mat board, poster board, or foam board.
79. Non-action photo – horse without movement – 8"x10" mounted on 11"x14" mat board, poster board, or foam board.
80. Horse or items related photo – (tack, trailer, clothing, statue, etc.) but no live horse – 8"x10" mounted on 11"x14" mat board, poster board, or foam board.
81. Item built from wood – (rocking horse, furniture, etc.)
82. Item made from wood – horse use (saddle rack, tack box, etc.)
83. An exhibit of any other phase of the project
