Rules and Instructions

- b) Exhibitors are responsible for securing to the display or exhibit all loose pieces of the entry (i.e. wire, zip ties, string, or glue).
- c) All models should be mounted on a base or platform no larger than 18"x18".
- d) Posters must be no larger than 14"x22" and have a title. Displays must be no larger than 28"x40".
- e) Pictures can be cutouts, drawings, or photos.
- f) Pictures should be glued on to a poster or mat with rubber cement and be labeled.
- g) No real food (i.e. vegetables, fruit, etc.) or live animals are to be exhibited.
- h) Put name, age, club, class, and lot number on the back side of every entry.
- i) Exhibitors can enter up to 4 lots.

- a) Read the General Fair Rules & Instructions document!!
- b) No more than 4 Lots entered.
- c) No prepared foods or animals are to be exhibited.
- d) Posters must be no larger than 14"x22", and displays must be no larger than 28"x40", unless otherwise stated. Trifold boards cannot exceed 28"x40".
- e) Scrapbooks must have a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 10 pages.
- f) Displays other than posters can include diorama, mobiles, shadow boxes, 3-D models, booklets, etc.
- g) Poems should be 40 lines or less.
- h) Stories, interviews, etc. 250 words or less.
- i) All rocks, minerals and fossils need to be clearly labeled.
- j) Exhibitors are PROHIBITED from duplicating exhibits and entering them in this and another department (i.e. entering same photo in Exploring and Photography departments)
